### **Are They Making You Crazy? It Might Be You!**

Join us as we take a lighthearted approach to the important topic of how to develop a child centered and positive approach to guiding the behavior of young children.

This training looks at the stages of developing writing and how you can support this development. Also, learn how you can set up your environment to encourage early

learners to write and how to provide accommodations to support all learners.

### **Taming Temper Tantrums**

This session will discuss the types of temper tantrums, why children have them, and ways that you, as caregivers, can help children increase their social emotional competence and move past tantrums.

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**Orientation I - Overview for participants who are interested in starting the business of child care** - This child care start-up workshop provides an overview for participants who are interested in starting the business of child care in a home, center, or ministry setting, and is the first part of a two-part series. It covers regulatory requirements, resources, and some information on health, safety and business practices. It serves to help participants with the decision-making process for choosing which type of care they would like to provide.

**Orientation II - A requirement for family child care providers to become licensed-** Preparation for Home Child Care Licensure is the 2nd training in this two- part series designed to outline regulatory requirements, licensing steps and resources for providing licensed child care in a home environment. You will leave this training prepared to take the next steps to licensing your home and will receive the necessary paperwork.

### **Safe Sleeping Practices and Reducing the Risk of SIDS in Child Care -**

Participants will increase their understanding of a safe sleeping environment for infants from newborn to twelve months of age. Focus will be on creating a safe and healthy sleeping area, risk reduction strategies for Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), and accidental death prevention. This training is a pre-service requirement that satisfies Public Law 162-205 for home licensure, as well as Provider Eligibility Standards Certified home providers (CCDF Voucher). Child care providers from all settings are encouraged to attend this free training.

**Health and Safety - Day 1** - This course is an introduction to child development touching on each developmental domain for infants, toddlers and preschoolers. Providers will be able to define child development, examine developmental domains for infants, toddlers and preschoolers. Providers will also identify how to involve and collaborate with parents to support positive child development. Providers will also identify causes of childhood obesity and the link to physical activity. This training meets the Health and Safety orientation training requirements for topic areas: 8. Prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices (if applicable), and 11. Major domains of Child Development (recommended)

(April 7th, 6:15p-8:45p, Tippecanoe County)

**Health and Safety - Day 2** - Providers will evaluate their current nutritional practices through a self- assessment and will compare nutritional needs of children based on age.

Provider will also discuss and compare allergies versus intolerance to food. Recognize nutritional requirements for children and promote healthy eating. Describe common food allergies and signs of an allergic reaction. Safely store, administer and properly document the use of medications. This training meets the Health and Safety orientation training requirements for topic areas: 2. Administration of medication consistent with standards for parental consent 3. Prevention and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions

(April 14th, 6:15-8:45p, Tippecanoe County)

**Health and Safety - Day 3** - This training will focus on vaccinations and medications. Discussing how vaccinations work and why it is important to immunize children and adults. Providers will discuss current medication storage and distribution practices. Physical activity and infection disease are other areas of health for children that will be discussed in this training. Implement strategies to stop the spread of infectious diseases including immunizations. Describe the relationship between a developmental stage and risk of injury. Implement procedures for storing medication and hazardous materials. This training meets the Health and Safety orientation training requirements for topic areas: 1. Prevention and Control of Infectious disease (including immunizations) 2. Administration of medication consistent with standards for parental consent 6. Handling and storage of hazardous materials and appropriate disposal of bio-contaminants 10. First Aid and CPR Overview

(April 21st, 6:15p-8:45p, Tippecanoe County)

#### **Health and Safety - Day 4 -**

Providing a safe environment and planning for emergencies are vital. Through education and proper transportation safeguards, providers can ensure children's safety and prevent injuries. Providers will define the relationships between development stages and risk of injury. Define steps to maintain safe building, grounds, and equipment. Create plans for keeping children safe in an emergency. Discuss policies for transporting children safely. This training meets the Health and Safety orientation training requirements for topic areas: 4. Building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic 5. Emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies resulting from a natural disaster, or a man-caused event 7. Appropriate precautions in transporting children.

#### **School Age Child Development, Module -**

During the school-age years, the brain continues to undergo changes and develop - socially, emotionally, physically, and cognitively. Caregivers and teachers are in a unique position to provide a variety of experiences that support all areas of development. This course addresses the basic principles of development for school-age children and implications for learning environments. 11. Major domains of Child Development (recommended).

#### **Introduction to the Indiana Early Learning FOUNDATIONS**

In this introduction to the Indiana Early Learning FOUNDATIONS (Revision 2015), learn how this early learning development framework provides core foundations and skills that children are to achieve at various ages. Explore ways to connect the Areas of Development of the FOUNDATIONS to providing appropriate learning experiences for young children.

### **Child Abuse and Neglect Detection and Prevention -**

Created by the FSSA, Bureau of Childcare's Health Consultants, this one hour training provides participants with information on the prevalence of abuse and neglect, causes and prevention of abuse and neglect, and how to report abuse and neglect. This training will meet the standard for completing Child Abuse Detection and Prevention training as required by Indiana law for Unlicensed CCDF providers as well as any other child care providers who are required to complete the training.

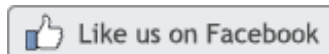
